

Acts Alive ...

Serving Up "The Word"

The congregation in Jerusalem had a big problem—the number of disciples kept increasing! Furthermore, as a spin-off of this big problem, some of the widows of the congregation who were dependent upon the spiritual community for their daily sustenance were being neglected because the apostles simply could not get the job done. The result—murmuring in congregation

So what did the apostles do? Did they say, "Let's slow this thing down a bit so we can get control of it?" Did they say, "We're sorry that we just haven't been around to see all of you widows, and we promise that we'll make it a high priority in the future?"

Here's what they did say: "It is not desirable for us to neglect

the word of God in order to serve tables. But select from among you, brethren, seven men of good reputation, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may put in charge of this task. But we will devote ourselves to prayer, and to the ministry of the word" (Acts 6:2-4). The word of God is not to be neglected, they said. As important as physical food is to physical sustenance, the apostles were not going to quit serving up the word so that they could serve up food. In fact, they were going to devote themselves to prayer and to serving up the word!

The "word of God" at first was His direct word in bringing the physical creation into existence during Creation week. Next, He spoke directly to the patriarchs such as Noah and Adam, giving them instruction. As Moses began to write the communications of God down, the next phase was introduced: God spoke to Israel through the prophets. Then, in the final stage, God "in these last days has spoken to us in His Son" (Hebrews 1:2). This

stage, God "in these last days has spoken to us in His final word, however, was transmitted through the apostles. Jesus thus described the future church in His prayer recorded in John 17 in these words as "those who believe in Me through their [the apostles'] word" (John 17:20). That, then, which was delivered to the apostles through the revelation of the Holy Spirit, was extended through the New Testament prophets and other gifts of the Spirit. Thus, the "word of God" is now complete and in written form, ready to be translated, distributed, and preached throughout the world.

Let's consider for a moment some of the important things connected with the word of God:

- It gives us the wisdom which leads to salvation (2 Timothy 3:12).
- · Saves our souls (James 1:21).
- Causes us to be born again (I Peter 1:23)
- It is the source of perseverance and encouragement (Romans 15:4).
- It is able to build us up and to give us the eternal inheritance (Acts 20:32).
- It performs its work in us who believe (1 Thessalonians 2:13).
- It is able to judge the thoughts and intents of the heart (Hebrews 4:12).
- It is the seed of the kingdom (Luke 8:11).
- Makes us able to call certain things to mind (2 Peter 1:15).
 It is able to impart life (Galatians 3:21).
- It is to spread rapidly and be glorified (2 Thessalonians 3:1).
- It will judge the world in the last day (John 12:48).
- Even this short listing of important aspects of the word of God shows that there is nothing in our lives that can truly have a higher priority. That's why the apostles said, "It is not desirable for us to neglect the word of God to serve tables." They needed to keep serving up the word of the Lord, which was and is able to save men's souls.

"And this statement found approval with the whole congregation" (Acts 6:5). May it continue to be so today!
